

# Fees and Fines

#### **Fees**

Variable charges imposed by court and other system actors

To recoup costs of the system

#### **Fines**

Fixed monetary penalties imposed by the court, usually according to the alleged offense

To punish and deter behavior

## **Long-Lasting Economic Strain**

- Youth are indigent by nature of their age.
- Most youth in the system come from low-income families that cannot afford to pay.
- Subject to involuntary collection mechanisms, including wage garnishment and tax refund intercept
- Can be converted into civil judgments

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#### EARNINGS WITHHOLDING ORDER FOR COURT-ORDERED DEBT

We issued an Earnings Withholding Order for Court-Ordered Debt to your employer to collect your delinquent court-ordered debt oursuant to Section 19280 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, and Section 706,074 of the California Code of Civil Procedure.

#### Your employer must do the following:

- 1. Deliver all pages labeled EMPLOYEE'S COPY of the Earnings Withholding Order for Court-Ordered Debt
- 2. Calculate the withholding amount using the Withhold Chart in section A on PAGE 18.
- 3. Begin withholding your earnings on the first pay period that ends at least 15 days after your employer receives: fhis order
- 4. Send payments until the Amount Due is paid or until we release this legal order. If you terminate employment, this order remains in effect for one year after termination date. If this employer rehires you during that period, your employer must resume withholding your earnings and send them to us - unless the Amount Due has been paid.

#### PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS



### **Disproportionate Impact by Gender**

- 83% of family members who were responsible for paying for a loved ones' court-related costs were women
- Women also face higher dollar amounts in fines, fees, and restitution than their male counterparts.



#### Status of Youth Fee & Fine Elimination (2024)

Full Abolition: Legislation repealed all youth fees AND all youth fines.


Substantial Elimination: Legislation repealed all youth fees OR all youth fines.

Partial Elimination: Legislation repealed at least one youth fee and/or fine.

Pending Legislation: A repeal bill was introduced and is currently pending in the legislature.

Local or Other Reform: Locality repealed at least one youth fee and/or fine or some other non-legislative repeal was enacted.

No Reform Enacted: No reform enacted at the state or local level to repeal youth fees or fines.

# Impact on Youth and Families



- More than \$700 million debt discharged in reform states.
- More than \$25 million that families don't need to pay each year
- Almost 200,000 families relieved of this debt each year
