



- **Broad Reach**: Supported 1,715 organizations & 685 students and teachers




- **Encouraging Philanthropy**: Actively promoting and facilitating giving to address local needs

- Convening and Sharing Community Voices: Centering the lived experiences of community members and shifting the narrative around critical issues




# The Winston-Salem Foundation Scholarship Program

- October 2023 marked 100 Years of the Scholarship Program
- 162+ Individual Scholarship Funds
- In 2022:
  - Awarded 743 Scholarships to 643 students
  - \$1.7 Million in Awards
- Common Application
- Utilize FAFSA data points to determine financial need
- Scholarships vary from \$1000 \$12,000
- Renewable & Non-Renewable Awards







# THE INSTITUTE FOR COLLEGE ACCESS & SUCCESS

- Public colleges enroll more than three-quarters of undergraduate students, including 81% of students of color, yet state support has been declining for decades.<sup>1</sup>
- Black college graduates owe an average of \$25,000 more in student loan debt than white college graduates.<sup>2</sup>
- 66% of all student loan debt belongs to women. Compared to other women, Black women have the highest level of student debt following college graduation at \$29,051<sup>3</sup>
