

Central Texas Asset Funders Network Program Officer

Job Posting

The Asset Funders Network (AFN) is a national membership organization engaging philanthropy to advance economic opportunity and prosperity.

The Asset Funders Network is seeking a skilled, highly motivated and entrepreneurial individual to join the organization as the Central Texas AFN Program Officer. The Program Officer will have deliverables with a particular focus on developing the Central Texas chapter of AFN including cultivating and facilitating the Central Texas AFN Steering Committee, engaging area funders and financial institutions as members and participants in regional and national AFN activities, as well as developing responsive programming aligning with goals and strategies established by the regional chapter.

As part of the role, the Program Officer will coordinate with local funders to define and address issues of common interest, as well as work with AFN regional funders to develop initiatives and align strategic grant making.

The Program Officer will also support funders to align investments to support Central Texas AFN strategic issues reflected in the AFN Strategic Work Plan.

Deliverables and Services

- Under contract, the employee serving as AFN's Central Texas Program Officer is specifically responsible for defined deliverables reflecting Central Texas AFN priorities.

Connect and Build

- Engaging grantmakers and financial institutions with AFN's value proposition and potential of peer technical support, shared metrics, and aligned funding efforts.
- Cultivating the AFN chapter including coordinating follow up efforts, hosting events, and cultivating and engaging funders as members and asset building investors.
- Leading the continued development of a sustainable chapter supported by funders and financial institutions.

- Organizing and supporting a Central Texas AFN Steering Committee by developing meeting agendas, content for webinars and convenings, and, where appropriate, helping to prepare aligned or shared actions.
- Providing information and fiscal feedback via the AFN CFO to the regional Steering Committee for them to transparently understand chapter membership and fiscal capacity.
- Engaging at least 2 funders/financial institutions who are not members to add at least 2 active regional members in 2023.

Inform and Elevate

- Implementing the AFN Strategic Work Plan to achieve deliverables for the region.
- Creating a regional work plan including goals and planned activities, outputs, and timetable.
- Informing the grant proposals and reports (via the AFN Membership Director) to support Central Texas planned activities, or to support issue briefs or projects related to regional interests.
- Coordinating and supporting regional programming and convenings, e.g. funder/regional forums including identifying and coordinating 1-2 speakers and as appropriate related webinars and funder surveys.

Influence

- Representing AFN at conferences and funder groups as a thought leader.
- Providing support and content expertise to AFN webinars, conference sessions and meetings (as requested or as developed through a planning process).

Requirements

Full COVID-19 vaccination required.

- Minimum of seven years' experience in philanthropy or the non-profit field.
- Experience and comfort working independently, with remote colleagues.
- Excellent writing and presentation skills.
- Experience and comfort facilitating groups, managing events, and leading meetings.
- History working with philanthropy and/or nonprofits to advance social and/or asset building strategies.

Location for Work

The regional program officer would be based in Central Texas working remotely from his/her/their home or leveraged office space with the ability to travel to meetings as needed throughout the region.

Compensation

There is good potential for this position to grow in %FTE and compensation over time, particularly as new members and initiatives are undertaken.

Salary Range

This position starts at 33% of full-time employment which is equivalent to \$40,000 plus benefits.

Benefits

Benefits include a 401K contribution, health expenses reimbursement (QSEHRA), home office expense reimbursement (up to \$2500 per year), PTO, and more.

Term

November 1, 2022 - December 21, 2023 Initial Trial Term. Renewable annually upon performance.

Maximum hours of work

This employment contract for services estimated to average 30/40 hours per month over 14 months (commensurate with experience and the agenda of activities) anticipating that some months will have greater or lesser hourly requirements to meet deadlines or perform the required work. Depending on the work planned and fundraising for Central Texas AFN, the contract has the potential for growth in the hours.
